

The average adult has about 10 pints of blood, but a typical whole-blood donation is only 1 pint. Red blood cells have a short shelf life. They only last for 6 weeks (42 days).





The session began with an introduction by Mr. Thomas, emphasizing the interplay between habits, dreams, and motivation. Participants were invited to share their perspectives on the topic and discuss any personal experiences related to forming habits, the pursuit of dreams, and the role of motivation in their lives. The facilitator also conducted activities to map these concepts with real-life situations. Mr. Thomas initiated a discussion on habits, explaining their nature and how they are formed. Participants shared their insights on positive and negative habits they had developed, highlighting their impact on their daily lives and overall well-being. The group collectively explored strategies for identifying and breaking unhealthy habits and fostering positive habits that aligned with their dreams and aspirations. Participants then engaged in a guided exercise where they reflected on their dreams and long-term goals. They were encouraged to visualize their desired outcomes and consider the necessary steps. Mr. Thomas facilitated a brainstorming session, where participants shared their goals and strategies and discussed the potential challenges. The conversation then shifted to the topic of motivation. Mr. Thomas presented different theories and models of motivation, such as intrinsic and extrinsic motivation, and discussed the factors that influence motivation levels. Participants shared personal anecdotes about times when they felt highly motivated and explored strategies for sustaining motivation over the long term. Participants were encouraged to reflect on the underlying reasons behind their desires and dreams to deepen their understanding of motivation. They explored the connection between intrinsic motivations, personal values, and the fulfillment of their dreams. The group discussed the importance of aligning daily actions with long-term aspirations and maintaining a growth mindset to sustain motivation during challenging times. Mr. Thomas concluded the session by highlighting the significance of self-reflection, accountability, and support networks in fostering positive habits, pursuing dreams, and maintaining motivation. Resources, such as books, articles, and online platforms, were recommended to explore further techniques for habit formation, goal setting, and motivation enhancement.

Ms. Srividhya Nagaraju

She specializes in the field of leadership, training, and mentoring. She works as a senior facilitator for parity consulting and Training Pvt Ltd. She is a learning facilitator, Indic Wisdom enthusiast, and International TedEx speaker. She trains candidates in executive coaching, leadership development, corporate training, public speaking, and life coaching. The speaker talks about different types of feeling students are going through. The speaker does icebreaking activity by calling students in front and talking to them. What stops us from expressing fear, nervousness, worry, etc? All this happens because we think what people will think about us. The answer to this question is that judgment is a spectrum – perception (passing thoughts) which can be changed over time. Expressing yourself is also one of the critical aspects to consider. We are here to express, not to impress them. Impression happens automatically. How can we connect? How to build confidence among students. Students express themself how this talk helps them to improve their confidence.

Ms.Kannika Paramashiva

An Orientation session offered by JAIN Deemed-to-be University, on 3rd July 2023, for the students of ACCA as part of the DeekshaAaramb program being conducted for the First year batch 2023-24 by the speaker Ms.Kannika Paramashiva, on the concept of Yoga & Healing and its importance for selfawareness and self-care for the students. 
Mr. Anil Iyer
